Married couples face all kinds of tough decisions.

"We have found this coming-to-one-mind works beautifully in our marriages as well."— Terry Fullam

Oneness is **God's design**, and **his vision** of what marriage should be.

"Haven't you read," he replied, "that at the beginning the Creator 'made them male and female,' and said, 'For this reason a man will leave his father and mother and be united to his wife, and the two will become one flesh'? So they are no longer two, but one flesh." **Matthew 19:4-6**

Physical-sexual oneness...

Uniting of two worlds under one roof...

Oneness is an event and it's a process.

Coming to One-Mind in Practice

Assumption: As we lay down our lives for the sake of oneness, we become more of who God designed us to be, not less. (Matthew 16:25)

1. Acknowledge to the Lord that his thoughts are the BEST.

"your kingdom come, your will be done" Matthew 6:10

2. Pray together, we <u>LAY DOWN</u> all our feelings, fears, desires, opinions, agendas, positions, biases and personalities. AND, our need-to-be-right, our past histories and patterns, comparing ourselves with others and people-pleasing.

- **3.** We begin a relaxed and easy <u>CONVERSATION</u> on the topic at hand.
- **4.** We notice that some ideas start to <u>SETTLE IN US</u>. They come together. We are finding one-mind—God's mind. (resistance subsides)

The Benefits Package

- We know God's will with confidence.
- Because of this, we can endure together.
- It completely obliterates "I told you so!"
- It affirms my wife's value as a person in our relationship—her <u>intelligence</u>, her <u>capability</u>, and her <u>intuition</u>. (Eph. 5:26-27)
- It builds our oneness as a couple.
- Our character grows as we lay down our lives for oneness.
