THE RESPONSIVE LIFE

March 18, 2018 John 12:1-11 by Bob Branch Finding Jesus, Finding Life part 35

BIG IDEA: Being a Christ-follower begins with responding to Jesus and continues in a life of responsive relationship with him. Disciples are responsive to Jesus.

¹ Six days before the Passover, Jesus came to Bethany, where Lazarus lived, whom Jesus had raised from the dead. ² Here a dinner was given in Jesus' honor. Martha served, while Lazarus was among those reclining at the table with him. ³ Then Mary took about a pint of pure nard, an expensive perfume; she poured it on Jesus' feet and wiped his feet with her hair. And the house was filled with the fragrance of the perfume.

1. Jesus invites us into a life of <u>CONNECTED</u> Responsiveness to him.

GRATEFUL FRIENDSHIP

"I do not call you servants anymore. Servants do not know their master's business. Instead, <u>I have called</u> you friends." **John 15:15** NIrV

LOVING SERVICE

"Whatever you do, work at it with all your heart, <u>as</u> working for the Lord, not for people" **Colossians 3:23**

EXTRAVAGANT WORSHIP (Rev. 4:10)

⁴ But one of his disciples, Judas Iscariot, who was later to betray him, objected, ⁵ "Why wasn't this perfume sold and the money given to the poor? It was worth a year's wages." ⁶ He did not say this because he cared about the poor but because he was a thief; as keeper of the money bag, he used to help himself to what was put into it.

2. We can be responsive to a <u>CAUSE</u> and miss Jesus in the process.

"The king and his cause cannot be separated. But when the cause becomes king, you've lost. The progression matters." —Daniel Branch

"Lord, didn't we prophesy... drive out demons... and do miracles in your name? Then I will tell them plainly, 'I never knew you.'" **Matthew 7:22-23** (See Rev. 2:2-4)

⁷ "Leave her alone," Jesus replied. "It was intended that she should save this perfume for the day of my burial. ⁸ You will always have the poor among you, but you will not always have me."

- ⁹ Meanwhile a large crowd of Jews found out that Jesus was there and came, not only because of him but also to see Lazarus, whom he had raised from the dead. ¹⁰ So the chief priests made plans to kill Lazarus as well, ¹¹ for on account of him many of the Jews were going over to Jesus and believing in him.
- 3. We can have a <u>CALLOUSED</u> response toward Jesus.

"These people honor me with their lips, but their hearts are far from me." **Matthew 15:8** (Eph. 4:18-19)

4. We give a <u>CONVINCED</u> response when Jesus, his love and mercy, have finally become real to us. (Acts 28:24; Rom. 8:28f)
