WHAT IS ETERNAL LIFE? August 26, 2018 John 17:1-5 by Bob Branch Finding Jesus, Finding Life part 49

BIG IDEA: Jesus prays the heart of God in our hearing so we can know his passion to glorify his Father and to give us eternal life.

¹ After Jesus said this, he looked toward heaven and prayed: "Father, the moment has come. Glorify your Son, that your Son may glorify you... ⁴ I have brought you glory on earth completing the work you gave me to do. ⁵ And now, Father, glorify me at your side with the glory I had there with you before the world existed.

Glory is ¹ luminescence. (Mt. 17:2) ² weightiness. (2 Cor. 4:17) ³ splendor. (Hag. 2:9) ⁴ essential essence.

"The Son is the radiance of God's glory and the exact representation of his essence" **Hebrews 1:3**

1. Jesus and the Father are passionate about <u>GLORIFYING</u> each other and invite into that dance.

"might *be* for the praise of his glory." Ephesians 1:12

Jesus EXISTED BEFORE the creation—having left his former glory to rescue us, and then returned to glory. (Phil. 2) ^{1b} Glorify your Son, that your Son may glorify you ² just as you gave him authority over all flesh to give eternal life to all those you have given him. ³ And this is eternal life: that they know you, the only true God, and Jesus Christ, whom you have sent.

2. Eternal life is a <u>RELATIONSHIP</u>, more than a destination—given exclusively by where eternity and heaven are released to us now (continuing past death).

"I want you to show love, not offer sacrifices. I want you to know me." **Hosea 6:6** NLT

⁴ I have brought you glory on earth completing the work you gave me to do. ⁵ And now, Father, glorify me at your side with the glory I had there with you before the world existed.

3. Jesus brought glory to the Father by <u>COMPLETING</u> the assignment he was given.

Glory comes thru the cross.

"We are heirs of God and co-heirs with Christ, if indeed we share in his sufferings in order that we may also share in his glory." **Rom. 8:17**

We bring Jesus glory by completing the WORK he's given us to do.

"We are Christ's ambassadors, as though God were making his appeal through us." **2 Corinthians 5:20**
