## **GOD AND THE DARK TIMES**

September 16, 2018 John 18:1-10 by Bob Branch Experiencing The Passion of Jesus part 1

## BIG IDEA: God is working powerfully in crises, trials and suffering—in Jesus and in us.

<sup>1</sup> When he had finished praying, Jesus left with his disciples and crossed the Kidron Valley. On the other side there was a garden, and he and his disciples went into it. <sup>2</sup> Now Judas, who betrayed him, knew the place, because Jesus had often met there with his disciples. <sup>3</sup> So Judas came to the garden, guiding a detachment of soldiers and some officials from the chief priests and the Pharisees. They were carrying torches, lanterns and weapons.

## 1. God goes back to the <u>PLACE WHERE THINGS WERE</u> BROKEN to fix them.

<sup>4</sup> Jesus, knowing all that was going to happen to him, went out and asked them, "Who is it you want?" <sup>5</sup> "Jesus of Nazareth," they replied.

"I am he," Jesus said. (And Judas the traitor was standing there with them.) <sup>6</sup> When Jesus said, "I am he," they drew back and fell to the ground.

<sup>7</sup> Again he asked them, "Who is it you want?" "Jesus of Nazareth," they said.

<sup>8</sup> Jesus answered, "I told you that I am he. If you are looking for me, then let these men go." <sup>9</sup> This happened so that the words he had spoken would be fulfilled: "I have not lost one of those you gave me."

2. Jesus knows <u>WHO HE IS</u>, what will happen and how it will turn out—nothing catches him by surprise.

"Tell them "I am" sent you." Exodus 3:14

"I am" (John 6:35; 8:12; 10:9; 10:11; 11:25; 14:6; 15:1; 8:58)

"When I saw him, I fell at his feet as though a dead man."

<sup>10</sup> Then Simon Peter, who had a sword, drew it and struck the high priest's servant, cutting off his right ear. (The servant's name was Malchus.) <sup>11</sup> Jesus commanded Peter, "Put your sword away! Shall I not drink the cup the Father has given me?" (Lk. 22:51)

## 3. Jesus knows that victory comes THROUGH THE CROSS.

"He was pierced for our transgressions, he was crushed for our iniquities; the punishment that brought us peace was on him, and by his wounds we are healed." Is. 53:5

- We all have "garden-experiences"—intersections where God takes us by the hand and walks us through pain, sorrow and suffering. (2 Cor. 1:8-9; 12:7-10; James 1:2f).
- We need to acknowledge that God is working in our hardships. (2 Cor 1:9-10).
- We mustn't take matters into our own hands to escape these trials. Instead, we should "inquire of the Lord" to see what instructions he gives us. (Judg. 20:24; 1 Sam. 14:36; 2 Sam 2:1; Ex. 2:11ff).
