THE TROUBLE WITH SAND CASTLES

BIG IDEA: Calling Jesus, "Lord," means hearing him and doing what he says, which has real-world, ripple-effects our lives.

"Why do you call me, 'Lord, Lord,' and do not do what I say?

"These people honor me with their lips, but their hearts are far from me." **Matthew 15:8** (Is. 29:13)

What does it means to call Jesus, "Lord"?

You are no longer in charge. He is.

- 1. We <u>HEAR</u> him and <u>OBEY</u> him.
- 2. We are LISTENING for and HEARING him.

"Every part of Scripture is God-breathed and useful one way or another—showing us truth, exposing our rebellion, correcting our mistakes, training us to live God's way. Through the Word we are put together and shaped up for the tasks God has for us." **2 Tim 3:16-17** MESSAGE

As for everyone who comes to me and hears my words and puts them into practice, I will show you what they are like. They are like a man building a house, who dug down deep and laid the foundation on rock. When a flood came, the torrent struck that house but could not shake it, because it was well built. But the one who hears my words and does not put them into practice is like a man who built a house on the ground without a foundation. The moment the torrent struck that house, it collapsed and its destruction was complete." **Luke 6:46–49**

4. Hearing and not doing <u>DESTABILIZES</u> us in the storms of life.
