Have you ever looked at something that was so incredible, it changed you?

BIG IDEA: As you gaze at the God Jesus reveals, you morph and change into the best version of you.

"When Moses came down from Mount Sinai... he was not aware that his face was radiant because he had spoken with the Lord..." **Exodus 34:29–35**

⁶ He has made us competent as ministers of a new covenant—not of the letter but of the Spirit; for the letter kills, but the Spirit gives life.

⁷ Now if the ministry that brought death, which was engraved in letters on stone, came with glory, so that the Israelites could not look steadily at the face of Moses because of its glory, transitory though it was, ⁸ will not the ministry of the Spirit be even more glorious? ⁹ If the ministry that brought condemnation was glorious, how much more glorious is the ministry that brings righteousness! ¹⁰ For what was glorious has no glory now in comparison with the surpassing glory. ¹¹And if what was transitory came with glory, how much greater is the glory of that which lasts!

Old Covenant: brought Death; Condemned us; Temporary

Suzerain/Vassal covenant

New Covenant:

- God's own presence, the Spirit
- brings **LIFE**, sets things **RIGHT**, it **LASTS**.
